- Our last stop of the day will be Bracy's Nursery where we will see the entire plant production process from propagation to sale. Bracy's was a leader in offering climate appropriate fruit trees as part of their palette. We will enjoy dinner there.

After breakfast at the hotel, we head to LSU's Hammond Research Station and the Margie Y. Jenkins Azalea Garden. We then leave Louisiana and head for the Crosby Arboretum in Mississippi.

- Crosby showcases the flora of the Pearl River drainage basin. It includes longleaf pine savannahs, a gum pond, and other associated habitat. We will have time to wander and also enjoy lunch.
- From Crosby we will head north to the USDA Thad Cochran Horticulture Lab for a brief look tour.
- Our final nursery of the day will be GreenForest Nursery, owned by long time IPPS member, Dan Batson. GreenForest focuses on large container production and is noted for its magnolias.

The Beau is one of Mississippi's ritziest casinos. Tour participants can choose to arrive on this date for the first board meeting. Airports include New Orleans, Gulfport/Biloxi, or Mobile. Often flights into the smaller airports are cheaper. All are close.



- Owned by longtime IPPS member, Jeff Howell, Rocky Creek was founded in 1962.
- From Rocky Creek, we head back into Alabama and Van der Giessen Nursery, owned by IPPS Southern Region North America President Maarten van der Giessen. Van der Giessen Nursery is a premier liner producer.
- From Maarten's we will head to Martin's Nursery, known for its immaculate production areas.
- We will be treated to a meal before a visit to the Mobile Carnival Museum. Mardi Gras was actually born in Mobile.
- From there, we head across Mobile Bay for a visit to Green's Nursery. Owned by longtime IPPS member Bobby Green, this nursery focuses on camellia production along with some other rare and unusual plants.

From Fairhope, we will enjoy some local seafood before heading back to our hotel.

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October 8, 2015

Following breakfast, we head to Flowerwood Nursery's Loxley location. Producing items ranging from 4-inch groundcovers to shrubs to branded plant innovations, Flowerwood has been a progressive industry leader for over 70 years.

- Leaving Alabama, we will head west into Florida. After stopping for a buffet lunch, we will spend some time relaxing at Chautaqua Winery in DeFuniak Springs, FL.
- Then we're on to Tallahassee, the state capital of Florida and home of Florida State University. We'll have dinner featuring regional fare before checking in to our hotel.

The Tallahassee area is home to a number of IPPS members and nurseries.

- We begin the day at Clinton Nurseries in Havana, FL.
- We'll then head over to Hackney Nursery between the cities of Quincy and

Greensboro. Covering nearly 600 acres, Hackney specializes in container-grown shrubs, perennials, and groundcovers in containers ranging from 1 quart to 15 gallons.

- After a lunch stop, we are off to May Nursery. In 1971, Fount H. May, Sr. and Don F. May, Sr., completely converted the family's tobacco farm to a nursery that concentrated on azaleas, ilexes and junipers. What they began has been nurtured and increased by their sons, Fount, Jr. Don Jr., Fred and Brad, who have assumed operation of the nursery. Now, third generation and IPPS members, Ashley and Richard May are continuing the tradition.
- Next we head to Monticello to visit Simpson Nurseries. The business was started in 1902 as the Simpson Nursery Company, a family partnership. By the early 1960's Simpson Nursery Company had become the nation's leading producer of pecan trees and watermelon seed. Simpson Nurseries is now a leading source of pecan trees, deciduous nursery stock and evergreens, building its sales primarily around retail nurseries, landscapers, mass merchandisers and pecan plantations.

After departing Simpson's we will head south toward Clearwater for an overnight stay. For attendees staying late in Florida, we'll be happy to provide information on local attractions. Just let us know!
