Visits to nurseries in the area of Lottum were enjoyed over the following three days, with access to the top business research centres in the Netherlands. This access is a privilege that is so often offered to the IPPS with its motto of 'Sharing Plant Production Knowledge'. Talks during the conference were typically varied and highly researched, ranging from 'Worldwide plant royalty management' to 'endogenous sugar level determining the state of juvenility and capability of cuttings to form adventitious roots'.
