Habata was transformed into a thriving operation that focused on citrus for the international market during the winter months and cucurbits for local consumers in summer. The Unifrutti Dunbrody Pack-house is located in the heart of the Sunday's River Valley between the towns of Kirkwood and Addo in the Eastern Cape province of South Africa. The Sunday's River Valley is responsible for almost 20% of South Africa's total citrus production. The Pack-house handles around 3.5 million cartons per season. Fruit is received from the Unifrutti owned Dunbrody Estates as well as reliable long term partners. Fruit is handled and packed to the highest quality standards to satisfy all market requirements.
